It is a never ending process.

Most of what I make I give away as presents to people. Last year starting in late October, I started making Rolling Pins for presents. Today I will show what I learned about making Rolling Pins.

### Resin Casting Supplies

1. Urethane Resin—Alumilite Clear Slow (no moisture, requires pressure) –[www.alumilite.com](http://www.alumilite.com)
2. Epoxy Resin—Liquid Diamonds (can tolerate low moisture, no pressure needed but recommended) - Amazon
3. Pressure Pot—Converted paint pot from Harbor Freight (YouTube on conversion, recommend Zac Higgins video)
4. Pressure Pot Caddy—[Ptownsubbie.com](http://Ptownsubbie.com)
5. Mica powder—Casters Choice— [www.Turntex.com](http://www.Turntex.com), [EZturnz.com](http://EZturnz.com) (has some color change, glow, & chameleon), [Ptownsubbie.com](http://Ptownsubbie.com), [blackdiamondpigments.com](http://blackdiamondpigments.com), [eyecandypigments.com](http://eyecandypigments.com), [SolarColorDust.com](http://SolarColorDust.com) (all kinds of color change, glow, chameleon, and more), and Amazon
6. Pigments & Dyes— Matte pigment—[www.divineturningsupply](http://www.divineturningsupply) (can color match), transparent dye—alumilite dye (available at many places including [alumilite.com](http://alumilite.com))
7. Molds-[Ptownsubbie.com](http://Ptownsubbie.com) (my favorite quality), Amazon—cheap silicone and easy to replace (look up baking molds too)
8. Scale—recommend one that plugs in and can go to 0.005oz. Mine only uses batteries so not recommended
9. Cups—Walmart in however many oz/color you might use. Silicone mixing cups (reusable) - Amazon, thin flexible paint mixing containers from Home Depot
10. Split pour cup—silicone—[www.mikerhodewoodworking.com](http://www.mikerhodewoodworking.com), 3d printed ones— etsy or reach out to members with a 3d printer
11. Temperature gun—Amazon (especially for Alumilite clear (slow) if you want max color separation)


## News
